**(1) That the said (c) ..... shall not exhibit, or permit to be exhibited, in the said (a)..... any film other than a film which has been certified as suitable for public exhibition by an authority constituted under section 6 of the Cinematograph Act, and which, when exhibited, displays the prescribed mark of that authority, and has not been altered or tempered with in any way since such mark was affixed there to,**

(2) That the said (c) .....shall cause to be exhibited at each performance after 30th September, 1946 in the (a)..... one or more "approved films" the total length of which is not less than one thousand feet or an "Approved film" exceeding 750 feet in length in case of cinema exhibited 35 M.M. films and 400 feet in case of cinemas exhibiting 16 M.M. films and shall comply with any direction which the Uttar Pradesh Government may, by general or special order, give as to the manner in which 'approved' films shall be exhibited in the course of any performance.

Note : An 'approved film' means a Cinematograph film approved by the Central Government or by the Government of Uttar Pradesh for the purpose of exhibition in compliance with condition (2) of the licence.

(3) That the said (c).....shall not exhibit or permit to be exhibited in the said (a).....to any person who is not an adult or any film which has been certified by an authority constituted under section 6 as suitable for public exhibition restricted to adults.

Note : The condition shall not be construed as prohibition to the exhibition of a film in respect of which an 'A' certificate has been granted to children in arms below the age of three.

- (4) **That the said (c) ..... shall not exhibit or cause to be exhibited at any performance in the said (a).....** (1) any advertisements regarding sexual diseases and medicines to correct sexual disorders or purporting to assist the childless in begetting children, etc. and (2) any indecent, obscene, immoral or suggestive advertisements, pictures or posters on the premises of the said (a).....
- (5) That the said (c)..... shall give a preview of the film to the District Magistrate or any other corporation officer deputed by him if it is reported or it comes to the notice of District Magistrate that the exhibition of the film or any portion there of is liable to cause breach of peace.
- (6) That the said (c)..... shall send previous information of every film proposed for exhibition to the District Magistrate together with the synopsis at least one week or, for good and sufficient reasons accepted by the District Magistrate upon application by the licensee, three days before exhibition is proposed PROVIDED that if the said (c)..... has submitted to the District Magistrate in accordance with the provisions of the condition a program in respect of a number of films within a specified period of one month or less it shall not be necessary for the licensee to inform the District Magistrate of any change he intends to make within that specified period in the proposed date for exhibition of films included in the programme originally submitted.
6. (A) That the said (c)..... shall specifically and clearly mention, in block and bold letters, the starting date of exhibition of the film on each poster, hand bill, pamphlets etc. used for advertisement of the film. The said (c)..... shall also ensure that the date mentioned is the same as informed to the District Magistrate under provision of Licence Condition No. 6.
- (7) That the said (c)..... Shall allow the following officers to inspect (a)..... situated at (b) ..... in order to see that the rules issued by the State Government are being observed-
  - (i) The Licensing Authority or the officer authorized on his behalf by the state government.
  - (ii) Regional Fire Officer.
  - (iii) Not exceeding two police officers, not below the rank of Sub-Inspector, deputed by the District Magistrate in consultation with the Superintendent of Police, and
  - (iv) Not exceeding two Magistrates as nominated by designation by the Licensing Authority.
- (8) That the total number of seats in the auditorium and the seats for each class shall not exceed the number specified in the Schedule hereto appended not shall the number and description of the Fire appliance, Exhaust fans, Electric fans or sanitary requirements be less than those there in specified.
- (9) That it shall be open to the Licensing Authority to amend or revoke the licence.
- (10) That the said (c)..... for the storage of cinematograph films under rule 24 of the Uttar Pradesh Cinematograph Rules, 1951 shall comply with**

**conditions 1 to 16, specified on licence form 'C' as prescribed under Article I of Schedule III of the Cinematograph Film Rules, 1948, as amended from time to time.**

- (11) That the said (c).....shall not display or cause to be displayed any photograph pictures or posters which depict or represent or purport to represent a scene or shot which has been excised from any film under the orders of the Central Board of Film Censors of the Central Govt.
- (12) That there will be no restriction on the number of daily shows in the Cinema between 9:00 A.M. and 12:00 (midnight) and no show shall be held before 9:00 A.M. and after 12:00 (midnight), i.e. shows shall start at or after 9:00 A.M. and must finish by 12:00 (midnight). No show should be held before 9:00 A.M. and After 12:00 (midnight) without the specific permission of the licensing authority which will be given only in very exceptional circumstances.
- (13) That no person below 18 years of age shall be allowed admission in shows held before 3:00 P.M. on working days.  
NOTE: Children up to the age of 5 (five) years accompanied by their parents or guardians shall be exempted from this restriction. This restriction shall also not apply on holidays. Holidays for this purpose shall include Sundays, Gazetted holidays and holidays and vacations prescribed by the State Education Department for educational institutions.
- (14) That juveniles below 14(fourteen) years of age shall not be allowed admission in the late night shows unless they are accompanied by their parents or guardians.
- (15) That the Manager's office shall be near the main entrance of the cinema on the ground floor and shall bear on the door in clear legible letters the words "Manager".  
NOTE: For cinemas not situated on the ground floor, 'Ground Floor' shall mean the floor on which the lowest portion of the auditorium is situated.
- (16) That the sound and light arrangements shall be such as to ensure good visibility and audibility to all spectators at all times.
- (17) (a) That the seats shall be kept in a proper state of repairs.  
(b) That the rows of seat in each class shall be marked and identified as A, B, C etc and seats in each row shall be serially numbered.  
(c) That all tickets issued for the two highest classes shall bear the seat numbers and the patrons shall be seated accordingly at least during the first three days of every first run film.  
(d) That the event of advance booking each ticket shall bear the seat number and patron shall be seated accordingly.
- (18) That all walls and floors shall be kept clean at all times, all floors shall be washed with disinfectant at least once everyday. All walls up to a height of 90 cms.from the floor shall be cleaned with a strong disinfectant at least once a month.
- (19) That a sufficient number of spittoons shall be provided at suitable places as specified by the licensing authority in the Schedule appended here to. The spittoons shall contain a strong disinfectant and shall be emptied and cleaned from time to time. Notices for using such spittoons shall be displayed prominently in the cinema premises.
- (20) That no vending of any tea, coffee, milk, cold drinks or other beverages or any edibles which are not in a sealed packet shall be permitted inside the auditorium.  
NOTE : (1) Conditions Nos. 20, 21, 22 and 23 shall not be applicable in the case of traveling cinema's.

(2) Condition 20 (c) and 23 shall not ordinarily be applicable to cinemas situated away from the district headquarters.

- (21) That the said (c)..... shall, besides sending information of every film proposed for exhibition to the District Magistrate as per condition No.(6) submit to the District Magistrate certified copy of the certificate information received from the Distributor of the film in accordance with the provisions of section 6.A. of the Cinematograph Act 1952 along with the original. The original certificate shall be returned after, perusal but the said (c).....shall keep the same readily available at the cinema along with a copy of the programme of the film submitted to the District Magistrate and produce the same for inspection before any officer empowered to carry out inspections of the cinema. He shall also ensure that the film, which is being exhibited, is the same for which a programme, synopsis and a certified copy of the above mentioned certificate received from the producer/distributor has been submitted.
- (22) That the said (c)..... shall besides sending information of every film proposed for exhibition to the District Magistrate, also intimate the name and address of the distributor from whom the film has been obtained and whether the film has been taken on percentage or fixed hire basis. In case a exhibitor has given his cinema on weekly hire then he shall obtain this information from the person who has taken the cinema on weekly hire and submit the information to the District Magistrate.
- (23) That Defense Personnel tickets shall be issued to defense personnel on producing of identity card and the number of the identity card or the name of the person concerned shall be invariably noted on the defense personnel tickets and on its counter file.

accepted by the District Magistrate upon application by the licensee, two days before exhibition is proposed:

- (7) That there will be no restriction on the number of daily shows between 9.00 A.M. and 12.30 A.M and that no show shall be held before 9.00 A.M. and after 12.30 A.M. without the specific permission of the licensing authority which will be given only in very exceptional circumstances.
- (8) That no person below 18 years of age shall be allowed admission in shows held before 3 P.M. on working days.

Holidays for this purpose shall include Sundays, Gazetted holidays and holidays and vacation prescribed for educational institutions.
- (9) That juveniles below 14 (fourteen) years or age shall not be allowed admission in the late night show starting from 9.00 P.M. and onwards unless they are accompanied by their parents or guardians.
- (10) That the sound and light arrangement shall be such as to ensure good visibility and audibility to at all times during the exhibitions and the seats shall always be kept in a proper state of repairs.
- (11) That all walls or floors of permanent video cinema shall be kept clean at all times: washed with disinfectant at least once every day and all walls up to a height of 90 cms from the floor shall be cleaned with a strong disinfectant at least once a month.
- (12) At least two spittoons for a seating capacity of 50 seats and one additional spittoon for every 20 seats shall be provided at suitable places. The spittoons shall contains a strong

disinfectant and shall be emptied and cleaned from time to time Notice for using such spittoons shall be displayed prominently.

5. Period for which the license is granted. Condition of License.

This license is granted subject to the provisions of the U.P. Cinema (Regulation) Act, 1955, and the rules frames thereunder and is also subject to the following conditions—

- (1) Any prescribed inspecting authority shall have free access to the said premises during business hours in order to see whether the conditions of the license are being complied with.
- (2) The licensee shall in respect of each film in his possession, produce when demanded by any officer prescribed under rules, a letter of consent from the person who is the first owner of the copyright under Section 17 of the Copyright Act, 1957 (Act XIV of 1957) and in case such copyright has been assigned under Section 18 of the said Act from the assignee of such copyright.
- (3) The licensee shall not, hire let on hire, distribute, exchange and put into circulation any film other than a film which has been certified as suitable for public exhibition by the authority constituted under Section 3 of the Cinematograph Act, 1952, and which when exhibited displays the prescribed mark of that authority and the same has not been altered or tampered within any way such mark was affixed thereto.
- (4) That the licensee shall regularly maintain the prescribed register.
- (5) The licensee shall furnish the information and submit monthly returns as required by the Licensing Authority within the time prescribed by him.
